Christ's Home - Children & Family Services (Residential Programming Services)

The health and safety of the residents and staff of Christ's Home (CH) continues to be of the utmost importance. The CH Leadership Team will continue to monitor available information related to the COVID-19 Pandemic and take the necessary steps to respond appropriately.

We will continue to follow the latest mandates issued by the Governor's Office, the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH), and the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE). The CH Leadership Team will continue to monitor communications. As conditions change related to COVID-19, protocols are subject to change.

An organizational COVID Council has been formed that meets periodically to monitor trends and update protocols as relevant.

Christ's Home does not provide education on site. Our residents attend school in the local communities and follow the health and safety protocols of the school district that child will be attending.

Virtual options are provided for all residents/students as the best individualized school programming is identified for residents.

Residents have individual service plans developed with external partners that address continuity of care and services for the youth in care that is responsive to changing dynamics.

Universal and correct wearing of masks;	Currently the CDC is recommending masking for unvaccinated individuals only, however, out of an abundance of caution, CH currently requires staff members to wear masks regardless of vaccination status when in close proximity within the living areas and other buildings on campus. PPE and education are provided to staff members and residents regarding proper wearing of masks. All guests are screened and must wear masks when inside CH buildings.
b.	Modifying facilities to allow for physical distancing (e.g., use of cohorts/podding);	Social/Physical distancing within the home is maintained where feasible and practical.
C.	Handwashing and respiratory etiquette;	Residents and staff are continually encouraged to wash hands frequently. Signage is provided throughout various buildings. Hand sanitizer and wipes are readily available to all individuals and buildings and CH cottages are equipped with multiple bathrooms for handwashing. Education is provided to staff and residents on proper hand hygiene and how best to cover sneezes and coughs. CH will continue to implement best practices developed in response to COVID-19 for keeping the workplace clean, disinfected, and safe for staff, residents, and visitors.

Cleaning materials including wipes and spray bottles will continue to be available in all rooms and offices. Ventilation systems will continue to be run additional hours to provide additional fresh air. Limiting shared materials and the use of equipment that cannot be easily cleaned will continue. Residents and staff will continue to be expected to share in the cleaning and disinfecting of high contact areas in the Cottages.

CH hosts periodic testing in our community center and if needed rapid testing for staff and residents could be coordinated with our retirement campus.
