

Sue and Al's connection to Christ's Home reflects their lifelong commitment to caring for children and nurturing faith. During their







From Foster Care to Faith: BEN'S JOURNEY OF HOPE AND ADVOCACY



Ben entered the foster care system at just 3 years old and remained in and out of care until he turned 18. He recalls his mother struggling with her mental health during his early years. For a time, Ben lived at Christ's Home's Lancaster Campus with his older sister. He remembers it as feeling like a big sleepover with friends, where everyone shared a similar experience of being without parents. His time there gave him a sense of family and community, helping him to feel less alone and less focused on his own challenges.

Later, Ben moved to Christ's Home's
Warminster Campus and attended Abington
High School. He has fond memories of
attending church with the house parents and
going roller skating afterward. "It felt like
family," he shared, "not like they were just
babysitting us." Eventually, Ben transitioned
into Christ's Home's Transitional Living

Program but chose to reunite with his mom and siblings.

In 2020, Ben began working at Faulkner Collision, and his mother is now doing well. He attends St. Luke's Catholic Church in Glenside and is strengthening his personal relationship with the Lord. Ben is passionate about advocating for children and teens in group homes who, like him, find themselves without parental care. Most importantly, he seeks to lead others to Christ, encouraging them to read the Bible and experience the fulfillment he found in surrendering his life to God.

Ben's life verse comes from Proverbs 4:23, "Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it," reminding him to set aside worldly desires so he can be fully used by God.

Sheltered by Love: A YOUNG MOTHER'S PATH FORWARD



Maria's journey is one of courage, resilience, and the transformative power of unconditional love. At just 16 years old, she found herself in a foreign land, far from her home in Central America, with her toddler and her boyfriend. Maria had little schooling and no road map for what lay ahead. Her life took a devastating turn when her boyfriend decided to take their daughter to the United States without her consent. Determined to reunite with her child, Maria made the brave decision to follow them, embarking on a long and uncertain journey to the United States.

Upon her arrival, Maria reached out to family members who helped her locate her daughter

in Pennsylvania. She soon discovered she was pregnant with her second child. Though she reunited with her boyfriend, their living situation quickly deteriorated. He was abusive and struggled with substance use, leaving Maria vulnerable and in danger. After an incident that landed her in the hospital, the county stepped in, and Maria was placed at Christ's Home.

At seven months pregnant and caring for her two-year-old daughter, Maria arrived at Christ's Home feeling anxious and overwhelmed.

She spoke little English and was still processing the trauma of her journey. But from the moment she walked through the doors, Maria felt something she hadn't experienced in a long time—safety. She was welcomed warmly by house parents who made her feel cared for and valued. For the first time, Maria saw that she was not alone. She shared a home with other teen mothers who, like her, were navigating challenges while striving to build better lives for their children.

Fast forward two years, and Maria's life is filled with hope and promise. She is now fluent in English, holds a visa, and is set to graduate from high school this June. She works part-time at a restaurant on weekends, and with the help of Christ's Home staff, who provide childcare, she

has been able to save money toward her goal of buying a car and eventually securing a home for her family.

When asked to describe Christ's Home in one word, Maria didn't hesitate: "Grateful." She admits there are days when her circumstances feel overwhelming, but she finds solace in the support of Christ's Home staff, who are always there to listen, encourage, and guide her.

Looking ahead, Maria has big dreams. After graduation, she plans to attend college and ultimately hopes to join the army to take advantage of the opportunities it offers. Her faith in Jesus remains a guiding light, and she dreams of joining a church where she and her daughters can grow together in faith and community.

Maria's story is a testament to the power of perseverance and the life-changing impact of a compassionate community. Christ's Home gave her not just a safe place to live but the tools, resources, and encouragement to build a future filled with hope and possibility.
